ROYERSFORD BOROUGH RECYCLING PROGRAM

Royersford Borough has contracted with A.J. Blosenski Inc., P.O. Box 392, Elverson, Pa 19520, 610-942-2707 to collect your recyclables. Recyclables are collected every Tuesday. Please refer to your borough calendar for holiday schedules. Customers of A.J. Blosenski Inc. can enjoy *single-stream* recycling; all of your recyclables can be placed together in the same container. No paper and commingle sorting required.

The following can be placed in your recycle container and mixed all together:

ALL ITEMS ARE TO BE EMPTY AND LIGHTLY RINSED, LIDS/CAPS/RINGS REMOVED.

- Aluminum food and beverage containers with food debris removed to include aluminum foil and pie/baking tins. Labels do not need to be removed.
- Glass food and beverage containers with lids and food debris removed: clear, brown, green. Labels do not have to be removed.
- Natural and pigmented plastic, narrow-neck containers with symbols 1,2,3,4,5,6,7 (milk bottles, water bottles, detergent bottles, shampoo bottles, bleach bottles, etc.) Lids and food debris removed. Labels do not have to be removed.
- Ferrous (iron, steel, tin) cans with food debris removed. Labels do not need to be removed.
- Newsprint – black and white or pigmented.
- Construction paper, kraft paper.
- Fiber-board such as cereal boxes, shoe boxes, or similar.
- Printer paper, computer paper, copy paper.
- Junk mail, magazines, catalogs and phone books.
- Corrugated cardboard (broken down to 2x2 ft. bundles)
- Empty gable-top milk and juice containers (quick rinse please).

List of some materials not accepted:

- Aluminum foil, cake/pie plates, broiler pans.
- Windows, drinking glass, mirrors, crystal, light bulbs, ceramic cups, plates.
- Flower pots, ovenware.
- Paint cans, oil cans/bottles.
- Clothes hangers (plastic or aluminum).
- Pet food bags, plastic bags, liners, waxed cardboard.
- Styrofoam cups and plates, Tyvek plastic envelopes.
- Tissues, towels, napkins.
- Electronics.
- Batteries, compact discs, DVDs.
- Yard waste, garden tools.
- Hazard chemical containers.
- Plastic toys, sporting goods.
- Soiled pizza boxes.
